(April 2009-March 2010)

**G**reetings to beloved members of the Fellowship in the name of Jesus, our Risen Lord!

A concise report of the activities of the Fellowship within the period specified is compiled herewith so that we may recount the blessings of the Almighty and give Him praises for the subliminal abundance showered on our Fellowship and every one of the members during the fellowship-year that has gone by. All the activities of the Fellowship have primarily been tuned with the broad objective of facilitating the members to worship God in Spirit and Truth in a manner that accommodates individual variances in mode of communicating with and worshipping God. Some of such activities within the past year are briefly highlighted below.

#### Regular Activities

1. **Sunday Worship Service:** The Fellowship, as usual, holds regular Worship Services every Sunday at the Apostles Methodist Church, R.K. Puram Sector IV at 5:30 p.m
2. **Adult Sunday School:** During the year gone by, one Sunday in every month was set aside for Adult Sunday School. The Book of Ephesians was chosen for study and classes were taken by Pastor, Rev. Dino L. Touthang. At the end of the year, an examination was held on 13 December 2009. Prizes were given to those who stood first, second and third in the examination. The winners were: First-Seikhohao Haokip; Second-shared by Nu Chongboi Khongsai and Gl. Robert Khongsai; Third-shared by Nu Boinu Haokip and Nu Chongbem Kipgen.
3. **Children Sunday School:** The Children Sunday School is an important component of our activities. Under the dedicated leadership of Gl. Ginboi Khongsai, Sunday School Superintendent, the children were taught Bible lessons by an excellent team of dedicated teachers:

The Children Sunday School is growing with more of our children attaining the entry age. Parents are encouraged to meet and appreciate the efforts of our dedicated youth workers and support them in their prayers. They are also encouraged to give support to the teachers by paying attention to the children's progress.

**4. Observance of Good Friday and Other Christian Occasions:** During the year major Christian occasions were observed. Good Friday was observed on 10 April 2009 with a Holy Communion Service at the Apostles Methodist Church, RK Puram. Palm Sunday, Pentecost Day, Thanksgiving Day were also observed.

**5. Christmas and New Year Celebrations:** Christmas celebration was organized at MTNL Hall, in Sector 6, R.K. Puram. New Year was celebrated with a Gospel Service at Apostles Methodist Church, Sector 4, R.K. Puram. Rev. Dino L. Touthang, Pastor of the Fellowship, was the Speaker on these occasions.

### Major Activities

**6. Family Camp 2009:** An Evangelistic Camp for families was organized from 25 to 28 September 2009, with Rev. Khaizakham and Rev. Dino L. Touthang as the Speakers among the parents, and Rev. Akhai and Mrs. Ngailhing among the Children (Sunday School students). The Camp, spearheaded by a sub-committee consisting of members--

--concluded with many blessings. Many families were blessed with renewed commitments and spiritual renewal; other families resolved relationship challenges through the word of God; yet others found reconciliation between husband and wife, children and parent, etc. As we close a year of blessing, we praise God for his re-assuring companionship through the year; we thank the sub-committee who managed the event so successfully to the benefit of the members.

**7. Youth Day-cum-Kut Celebration:** Another major event during the year, a Youth Day- cum- Kut Celebration was organized on 1 November 2009. The theme adopted for the event was *Setting our hope on the living God* (1 Tm. 4:10). The object behind the twin celebrations was to realign our culture with Christianity to overcome the uncalled for separation of culture from the word of God. While 'youth-day' is meant to be a special event wherein the youth of the Fellowship can praise and uphold the name of God for the many blessings in their life, such as youthful energy, health, opportunity, learning, beauty, zeal, and many more; Kut is a cultural festival held traditionally to give thanks to the God of good Harvest. It was basically a religious ceremony filled with thanksgiving. In view of the undesirable distortions in the way that Kut is being celebrated in recent times, the above event was being organized to state that we need not discard Kut, our culture, because of its distortions but rather reclaim it as part of our new Christian culture.

**8. Other activities:** Some of the other notable activities of the past year include:

- Observance of Mission Sunday on 12 July, in which the Mission workers were exhorted, felicitated and encouraged with prayers, gifts and the word of God. The Fellowship's sponsored missionary working in Friends Missionary Prayer Band, Mr. Yecto Chophi, was also invited all the way from Dimapur to share his experiences to the Fellowship.
- Mothers' Day Celebration and Thanksgiving on 10 May 2009
- Fathers' Day Celebration and Thanksgiving on 14 June 2009 Executive Committee Members and Prayer Cell Leaders' Leadership Seminar/Retreat on 24 October 2009.

**Worship Team:** A team of dedicated youth members of the Fellowship volunteered to form the Worship Team to lead the Praise and Worship during Sunday services led and coordinated by the Youth Secretaries. They include talented musicians and singers. The Fellowship is blessed through them and we need to continue to support them in our prayers.

**Aroma:** The monthly Bulletin of the Fellowship is edited by the Associate Pastor, Rev. Letlal Haokip. The Bulletin notifies the members of the Fellowship's activities during the past month and highlights the programme activities of the month ahead, including the Sunday Service programme. It also publishes the name of successful members in recruitments and prestigious academic entrances. It also lists prayer and praise points for the Fellowship members. The Bulletin also carries summary of sermons delivered by speakers at the worship services.

**Membership growth:** The Fellowship now has more than 700 registered members. Membership is available by nominal payment of Rs. 10 and submission of personal and family details for the records of the Fellowship. Membership benefits are provided exclusively to registered members in matters of felicitations, condolences, marriages, etc.

**Website:** The website of the Fellowship has regularly been updated and properly maintained by the dedicated efforts of Pa Thangboi Hangshing and Rev. Letlal Haokip. The Committee plans to have the Holy Bible in our dialect made available in our website during the current term. Let us have the people looking after the website and the new project in our prayers.

**Audit:** The first and second half yearly Audits were conducted with the active and dedicated efforts of Pa Limjathang Haokip and Pa Thangtinlen Singsit for the first half, and Pa Hegin Haokip and Pa Thangtinlen Singsit for the closing half. We thank them and pray that they continue to be a blessing to our Fellowship and the world around them.

**Welfare Ventures**

**Medical Camp:** The Fellowship sponsored a medical camp by granting the funds earmarked to Deeper Life Ministry run by Pastor Hengam Kipgen. The Medical Camp was successfully conducted at a Delhi Slum sometime in March 2010. A baseline survey was also sponsored through DLM to conduct project feasibility study in Sanjay Slum Area in trans-Yamuna for future intervention.

**Sunday Transport:** Transport facilities extended to students of DU campus and surrounding areas to facilitate their attendance in the Sunday worship services was continued by granting financial subsidy for the Bus hiring charges. Members from other areas are requested to understand the support to our student community and not raise similar subsidies.

**Relief:** Relief grant of Rs. 5000 was sent to victims of Kandhamal riots through a relief agency of Christians.

## Networking

The KWS Hyderabad celebrated their Decade year and invited the KWSD. They also sought financial assistance to organize the event. Rupees Ten thousand had been sanctioned and given as our contribution to the Fellowship. Rev. Dino L. Touthang, as our Pastor and also in his capacity as Chairman of the All India KWS Coordinating Committee, along with Rev. Letlal Haokip, as our Associate Pastor, attended the celebrations and the subsequent Business session of the AIKWSCC. The AIKWSCC adopted the emblem and motto of KWS Shillong for common usage by all KWS units. The resolution have been later ratified and adopted by the EC of our Fellowship.
